GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Performs investigative, administrative, and consultative law enforcement work. Performs investigative law enforcement work. May work as a lead worker providing direction to others. Work involves overseeing, planning, organizing, and conducting criminal investigations of violations of the Texas Penal Code and various state and federal statutes. Works under limited supervision, with considerable latitude for the use of initiative and independent judgment.

EXAMPLES OF WORK PERFORMED

Conducts and/or oversees administrative and criminal investigations into alleged violations of laws, rules, and regulations.

Collects and analyzes data through field studies.

Identifies, contacts, and interviews witnesses, subjects, and other relevant individuals.

Interacts and exchanges information with various state, local, or federal law enforcement organizations.

Plans, organizes, and records investigative activities and findings.

Prepares records, correspondence, and reports.

Prepares affidavits and subpoenas.

Prepares, reviews, and presents investigative reports and criminal case files for hearings.

Executes subpoenas, warrants, and court orders.

Maintains case files and evidence.

Testifies in administrative, judicial, and criminal proceedings.

May assist in performing undercover or surveillance work regarding suspected violators.

Performs related work as assigned.

GENERAL QUALIFICATION GUIDELINES

EXPERIENCE AND EDUCATION

Experience in investigative law enforcement work. Graduation from an accredited four-year college or university with major coursework in criminal justice, criminology, police science, or a related field is generally preferred. Experience and education may be substituted for one another.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES

- Knowledge of the Texas Penal Code, Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, and other applicable statutes; and agency rules, policies, and procedures.
- Skill in researching and interpreting complex rules and regulations, in interviewing techniques, in applying investigative techniques and procedures, and in the use of a computer and applicable software.
- Ability to use and care for firearms and law enforcement equipment; to use physical tactics; to conduct investigations; to evaluate, analyze, and investigate allegations of wrongdoing; to prepare reports; to prepare criminal cases for prosecution; and to communicate effectively.

REGISTRATION, CERTIFICATION, OR LICENSURE

Must be certified as a Texas peace officer by the Commission on Law Enforcement.

Must possess a valid driver's license.
