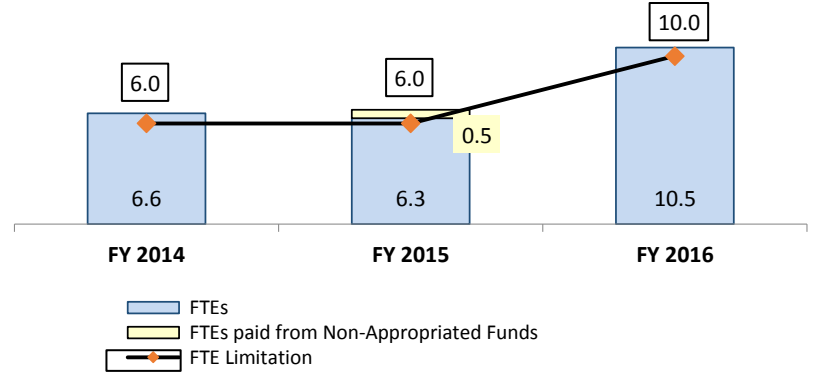

Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Employees

This agency was established on September 1, 2013; therefore, it does not have five years of trend data available. The agency's full-time equivalent (FTE) employee limitation increased by 66.7 percent to 10.0 FTEs in fiscal year 2016 compared to fiscal year 2015. Compared to fiscal year 2014, the agency saw an increase of 3.9 (59.1 percent) in the total number of FTEs. The agency employed 0.5 FTEs paid from non-appropriated funds in fiscal year 2015; however, those FTEs do not count against the FTE limitation.

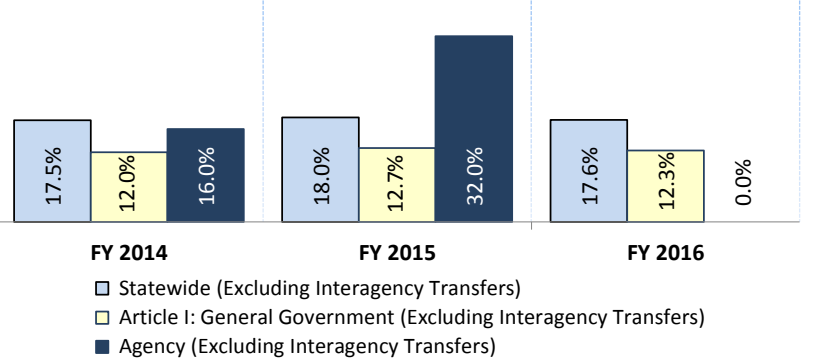
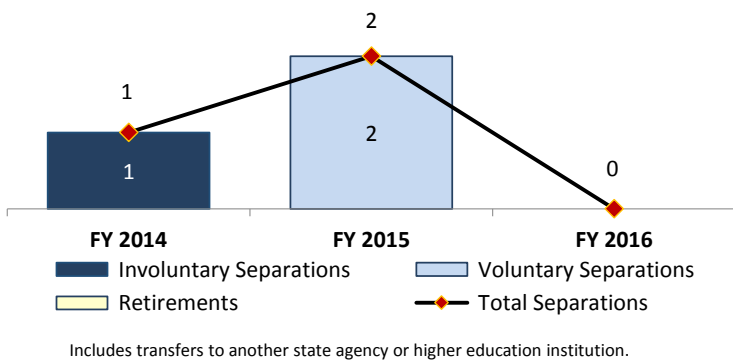

Employee Turnover ^a

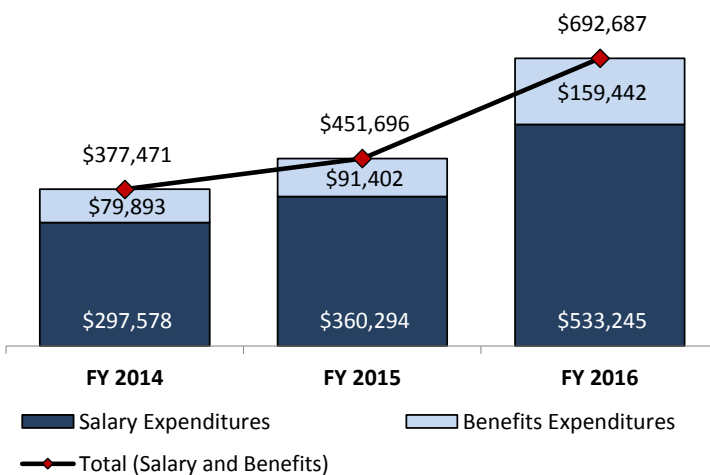
Excluding interagency transfers, the turnover rate within the agency (0.0 percent) was lower than the statewide turnover rate (17.6 percent) and lower than the turnover rate of Article I agencies (12.3 percent) during fiscal year 2016. The fiscal year 2016 agency turnover rate including employees who transferred to another state agency or higher education institution was 0.0 percent.



Compensation Information ^a

Currently, the average agency salary is lower than the article average, but higher than the statewide average. In fiscal year 2016, 78.9 percent of employees were paid below the midpoint of the salary range midpoint in which they were assigned.

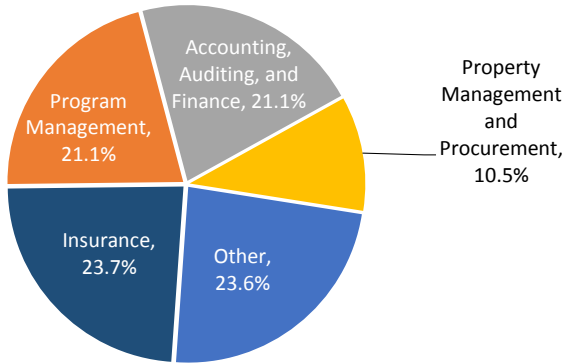

Fiscal Year 2016 Major Occupational Categories



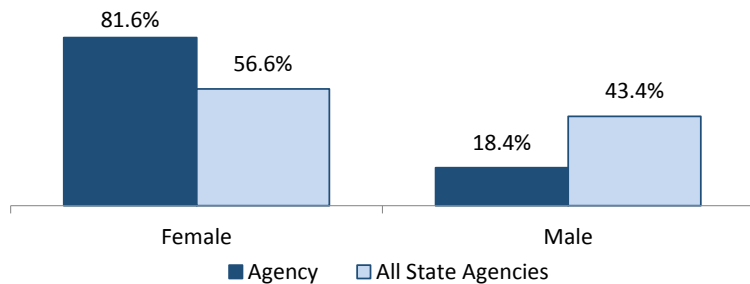
Agency Job Classifications

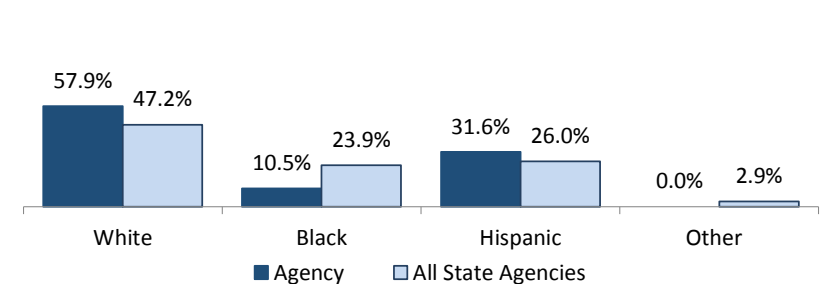
Fiscal Year 2016 Workforce Demographics^b

On average, employees at the agency were 45.3 years of age and had 1.5 years of agency length of service. Of the agency's employees, 60.5 percent were 40 years of age or older, and 100.0 percent had fewer than 5 years of agency length of service.

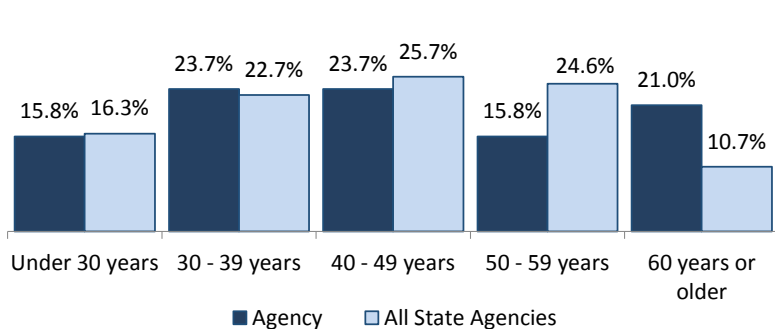
Gender



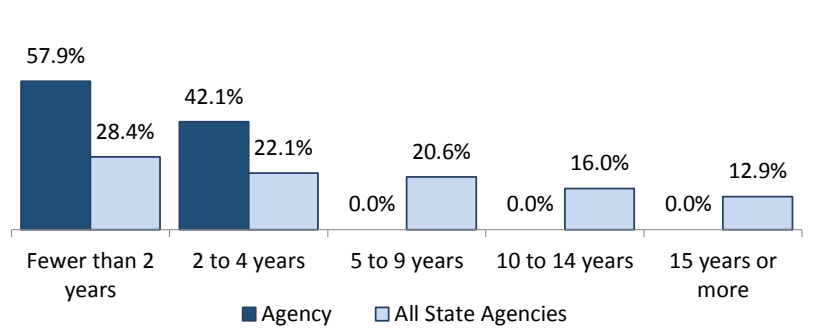
Ethnic Group

Agency Length of Service

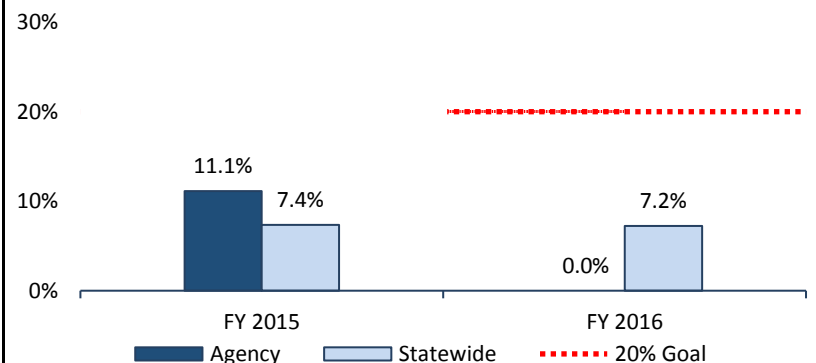

Veteran Employment^c

Senate Bill 805 (84th Legislature) amended Texas Government Code, Section 657.004, to set a goal for state agencies of employing veterans in full-time positions equal to at least 20.0 percent of the total number of agency employees effective September 1, 2015.

No veterans were employed by the agency in fiscal year 2016, a decrease from the agency's total percent of veterans employed in fiscal year 2015.
