




Fiscal Year 2020 Workforce Demographics ^c

On average, employees at the agency were 43.4 years old and had 9.4 years of agency length of service. Of the agency's employees, 53.2 percent were 40 years old or older, and 54.8 percent had fewer than 5 years of agency length of service.
