Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Employees


The agency's full-time equivalent (FTE) employee limitation decreased by 13.3 percent to 13.0 FTEs in fiscal year 2020 compared with fiscal year 2019. Compared with fiscal year 2016, the agency had a decrease of 0.5 (4.9 percent) in the total number of FTEs.



Employee Turnover ^a

Excluding interagency transfers, the turnover rate within the agency (21.6 percent) was higher than the statewide turnover rate (18.6 percent) and higher than the turnover rate of Article VIII and Self-Directed, Semi-Independent (SDSI) agencies (11.0 percent) during fiscal year 2020. The fiscal year 2020 agency turnover rate including employees who transferred to another state agency or higher education institution was 32.4 percent.






Compensation Information ^a

The average agency salary of \$76,551 in fiscal year 2020 represented an increase of 9.0 percent compared with the average agency salary in fiscal year 2016. In fiscal year 2020, 38.9 percent of employees were paid below the midpoint of the salary range in which they were assigned. Total agency expenditures for salaries and benefits were higher compared with fiscal year 2016.

Agency Job Classifications



On average, employees at the agency were 43.7 years old and had 8.8 years of agency length of service. Of the agency's employees, 67.6 percent were 40 years old or older, and 54.1 percent had fewer than 5 years of agency length of service.



Veteran Employment ^e

Effective fiscal year 2016, Texas Government Code, Section 657.004, sets for state agencies a goal of employing veterans in full-time positions equal to at least 20.0 percent of the total number of agency employees.

In fiscal year 2020, the agency's total percent of veterans employed was higher than the statewide average and had increased since fiscal year 2019.
