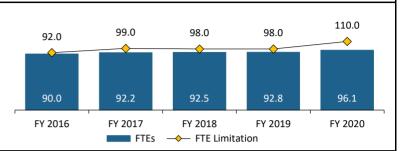

Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Employees

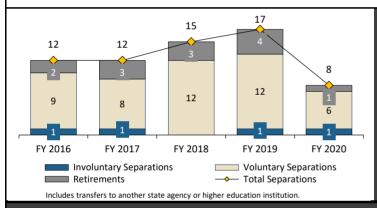
The agency's full-time equivalent (FTE) employee limitation increased by 12.2 percent to 110.0 FTEs in fiscal year 2020 compared with fiscal year 2019. Compared with fiscal year 2016, the agency had an increase of 6.1 (6.8 percent) in the total number of FTEs.

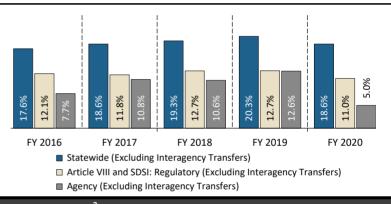

Employee Turnover a

Excluding interagency transfers, the turnover rate within the agency (5.0 percent) was lower than the statewide turnover rate (18.6 percent) and lower than the turnover rate of Article VIII and Self-Directed, Semi-Independent (SDSI) agencies (11.0 percent) during fiscal year 2020. The fiscal year 2020 agency turnover rate including employees who transferred to another state agency or higher education institution was 8.1 percent.





Compensation Information ^a

The average agency salary of \$57,022 in fiscal year 2020 represented an increase of 3.1 percent compared with the average agency salary in fiscal year 2016. In fiscal year 2020, 71.8 percent of employees were paid below the midpoint of the salary range in which they were assigned. Total agency expenditures for salaries and benefits were higher compared with fiscal year 2016.

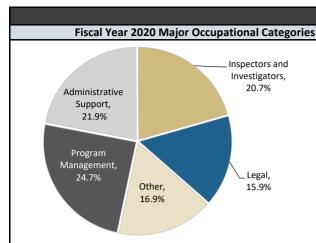

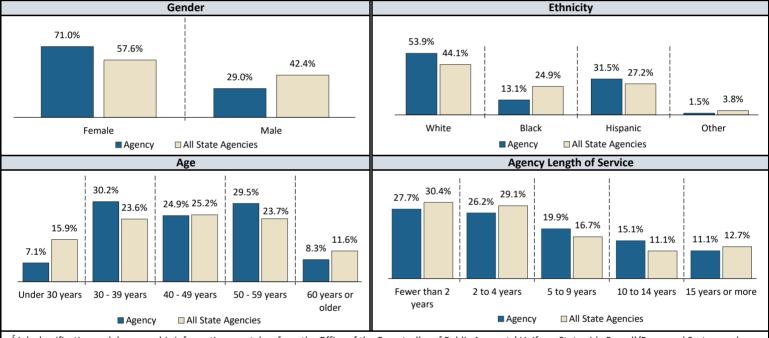

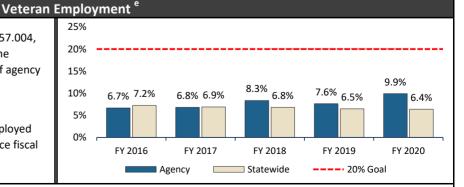
On average, employees at the agency were 45.5 years old and had 6.4 years of agency length of service. Of the agency's employees, 62.7 percent were 40 years old or older, and 53.9 percent had fewer than 5 years of agency length of service. The Employees Retirement System estimates that between fiscal years 2020 and 2024, 18.0 percent of the agency's workforce will be eligible to retire (based on fiscal year 2020 data).
