Workforce Summary Document prepared by the State Auditor's Office. Based on information self-reported by the agency, the following items are noteworthy.

## Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Employees

The agency's full-time equivalent (FTE) employee limitation increased by 2.0 percent to $3,304.8$ FTEs in fiscal year 2020 compared with fiscal year 2019. Compared with fiscal year 2016, the agency had a decrease of 8,700.5 (72.9 percent) in the total number of FTEs.


## Compensation Information ${ }^{\text {a }}$

The average agency salary of $\$ 51,834$ in fiscal year 2020 represented an increase of 29.7 percent compared with the average agency salary in fiscal year 2016. In fiscal year 2020, 82.9 percent of employees were paid below the midpoint of the salary range in which they were assigned. Total agency expenditures for salaries and benefits were lower compared with fiscal year 2016.

## Agency Job Classifications

In fiscal year 2020, the majority ( 53.3 percent) of employees were classified in the following job titles: Program Specialist (16.0 percent), Public Health and Prevention Specialist ( 9.6 percent), Administrative Assistant (7.1 percent), Manager ( 5.6 percent), Inspector ( 4.1 percent), Sanitarian (3.9 percent), Nurse ( 3.5 percent) and, Epidemiologist ( 3.5 percent).

## Classification Compliance Audit

During the past two years, this agency was not selected as part of our office's classification compliance audits.

## Fiscal Year 2020 Workforce Demographics ${ }^{\text {c }}$

On average, employees at the agency were 45.8 years old and had 6.5 years of agency length of service. Of the agency's employees, 63.8 percent were 40 years old or older, and 51.4 percent had fewer than 5 years of agency length of service. The Employees Retirement System estimates that between fiscal years 2020 and 2024, 21.0 percent of the agency's workforce will be eligible to retire (based on fiscal year 2020 data).

## Veteran Employment ${ }^{\text {e }}$

Effective fiscal year 2016, Texas Government Code, Section 657.004, sets for state agencies a goal of employing veterans in full-time positions equal to at least 20.0 percent of the total number of agency employees.

In fiscal year 2020, the agency's total percent of veterans employed was higher than the statewide average and had remained the same since fiscal year 2019.
