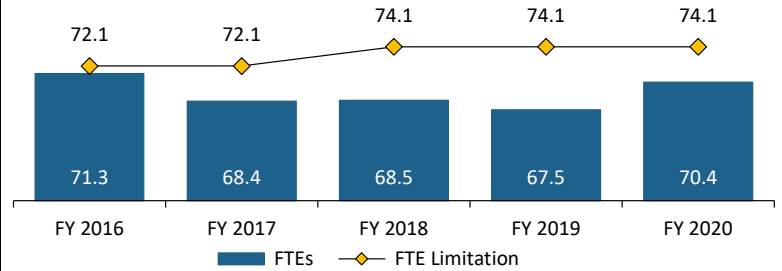
Workforce Summary Document prepared by the State Auditor's Office.
Based on information **self-reported** by the agency, the following items are noteworthy.

Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Employees

The agency's full-time equivalent (FTE) employee limitation remained the same in fiscal year 2020 compared with fiscal year 2019. Compared with fiscal year 2016, the agency had a decrease of 0.9 (1.3 percent) in the total number of FTEs.

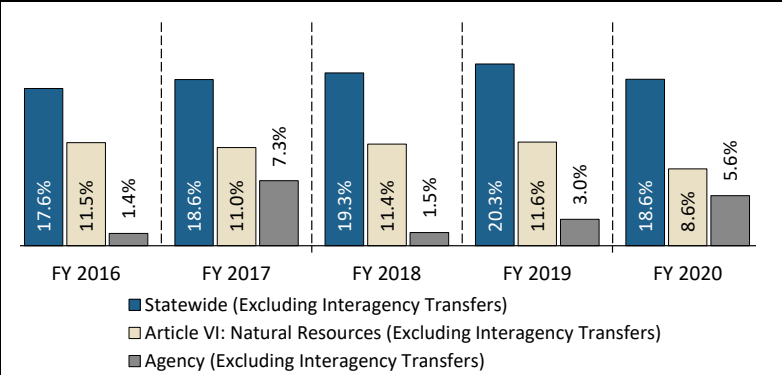
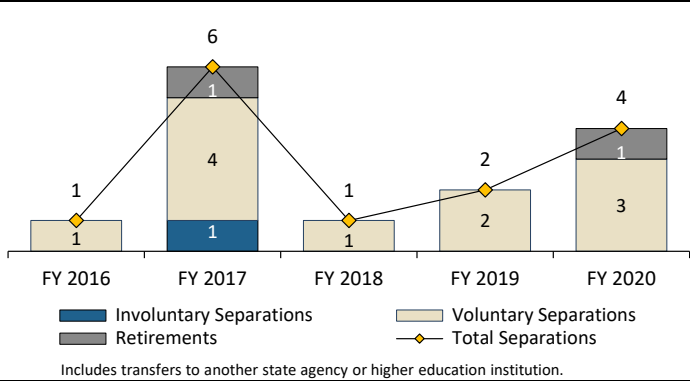

Employee Turnover^a

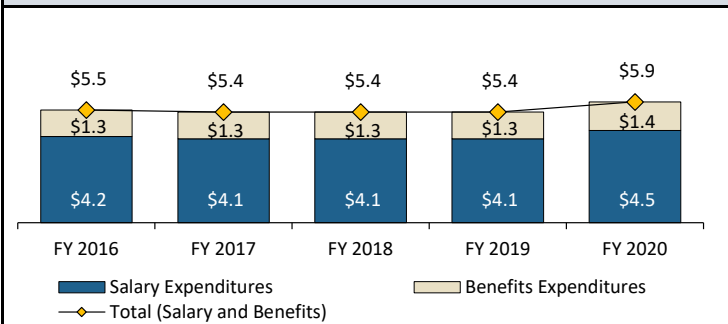
Excluding interagency transfers, the turnover rate within the agency (5.6 percent) was lower than the statewide turnover rate (18.6 percent) and lower than the turnover rate of Article VI agencies (8.6 percent) during fiscal year 2020. The fiscal year 2020 agency turnover rate including employees who transferred to another state agency or higher education institution was 5.6 percent.



Compensation Information^a

The average agency salary of \$61,011 in fiscal year 2020 represented an increase of 8.9 percent compared with the average agency salary in fiscal year 2016. In fiscal year 2020, 50.7 percent of employees were paid below the midpoint of the salary range in which they were assigned. Total agency expenditures for salaries and benefits were higher compared with fiscal year 2016.

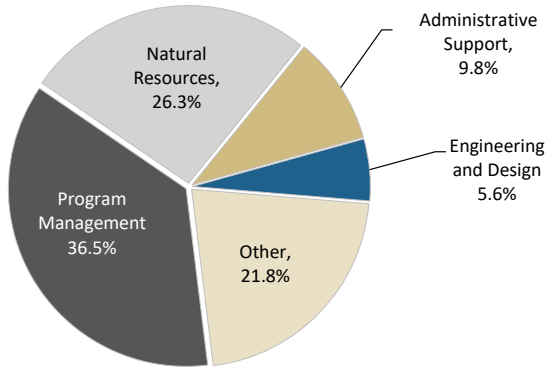

In fiscal year 2020, the majority (71.2 percent) of employees were classified in the following job titles: Natural Resources Specialist (26.3 percent), Program Specialist (19.6 percent), Program Supervisor (9.8 percent), Administrative Assistant (8.4 percent), and Director (7.0 percent).

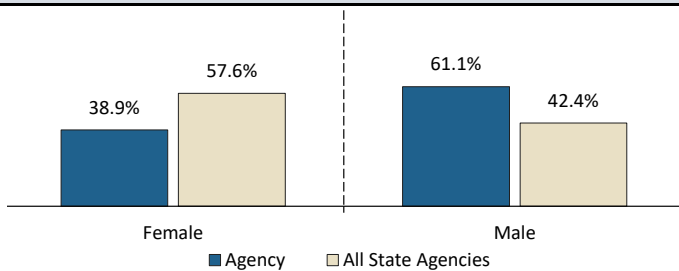
Classification Compliance Audit

As noted in the report titled *A Classification Compliance Audit Report on Information Technology Positions at Natural Resources Agencies* (SAO Report No. 19-706, February 2019), the agency correctly classified 66.7 percent of the 3 employee positions audited.

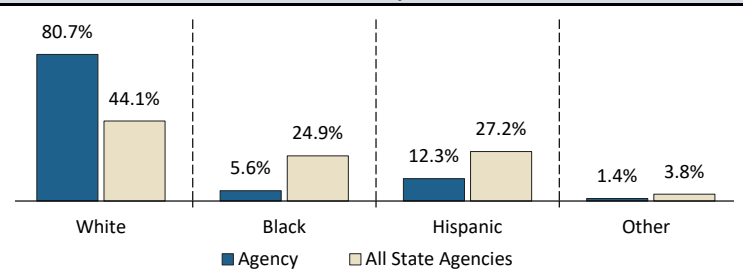
Fiscal Year 2020 Workforce Demographics ^c

On average, employees at the agency were 49.4 years old and had 13.1 years of agency length of service. Of the agency's employees, 73.3 percent were 40 years old or older, and 15.1 percent had fewer than 5 years of agency length of service. The Employees Retirement System estimates that between fiscal years 2020 and 2024, 34.0 percent of the agency's workforce will be eligible to retire (based on fiscal year 2020 data).

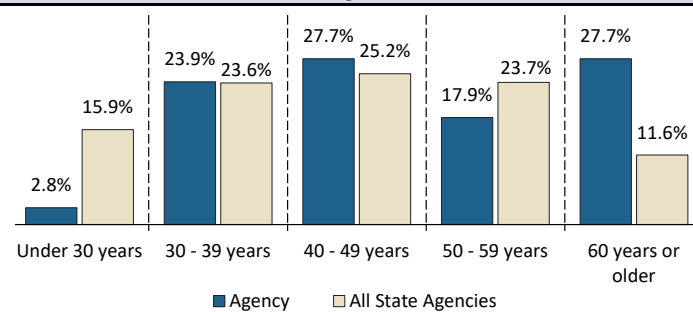
Gender



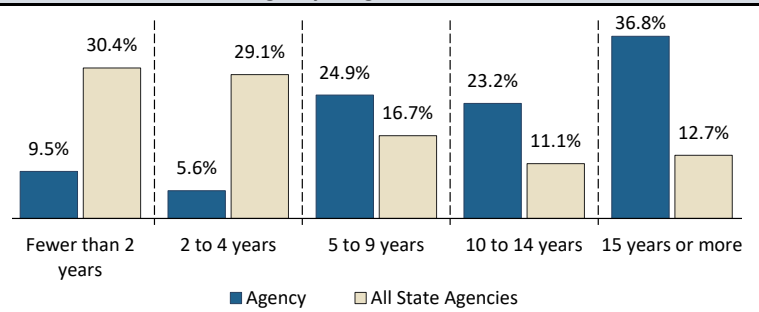
Ethnicity

Agency Length of Service



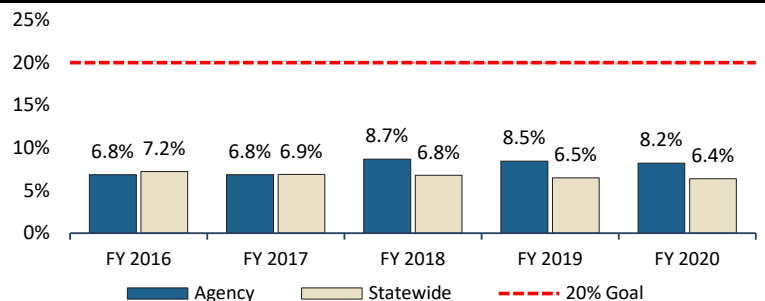

Veteran Employment ^e

Effective fiscal year 2016, Texas Government Code, Section 657.004, sets for state agencies a goal of employing veterans in full-time positions equal to at least 20.0 percent of the total number of agency employees.

In fiscal year 2020, the agency's total percent of veterans employed was higher than the statewide average and had decreased since fiscal year 2019.
