


The average agency salary of \$54,539 in fiscal year 2020 represented an increase of 3.5 percent compared with the average agency salary in fiscal year 2016. In fiscal year 2020, 70.3 percent of employees were paid below the midpoint of the salary range in which they were assigned. Total agency expenditures for salaries and benefits were higher compared with fiscal year 2016.



Fiscal Year 2020 Workforce Demographics ^{ce}

On average, employees at the agency were 48.5 years old and had 5.1 years of agency length of service. Of the agency's employees, 75.6 percent were 40 years old or older, and 50.9 percent had fewer than 5 years of agency length of service. The Employees Retirement System estimates that between fiscal years 2020 and 2024, 23.0 percent of the agency's workforce will be eligible to retire (based on fiscal year 2020 data).
