## 802 - Parks and Wildlife Department

Workforce Summary Document prepared by the State Auditor's Office.
Based on information self-reported by the agency, the following items are noteworthy.

## Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Employees

The agency's full-time equivalent (FTE) employee limitation increased by 0.5 percent to $3,162.3$ FTEs in fiscal year 2020 compared with fiscal year 2019. Compared with fiscal year 2016, the agency had a decrease of 54.1 ( 1.8 percent) in the total number of FTEs.

Additionally, the agency employed the following FTEs that do not count toward the FTE limitation: In fiscal years 2018, 2019, and 2020, the agency employed $0.5,1.0,0.7$ federally funded FTEs, respectively, and in fiscal years 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, and 2020, the agency employed 35.4, 21.2, 23.9, 17.7, and 0.8 FTEs, respectively, that included game warden cadets, interns, and FTEs paid from donations.

## Employee Turnover ${ }^{\text {a }}$

Excluding interagency transfers, the turnover rate within the agency ( 8.3 percent) was lower than the statewide turnover rate (18.6 percent) and lower than the turnover rate of Article VI agencies ( 8.6 percent) during fiscal year 2020. The fiscal year 2020 agency turnover rate including employees who transferred to another state agency or higher education institution was 9.2 percent.


## Compensation Information ${ }^{\text {a }}$

The average agency salary of $\$ 55,711$ in fiscal year 2020 represented an increase of 5.8 percent compared with the average agency salary in fiscal year 2016. In fiscal year 2020, 50.3 percent of employees were paid below the midpoint of the salary range in which they were assigned. Total agency expenditures for salaries and benefits were higher compared with fiscal year 2016.

## Veteran Employment

Effective fiscal year 2016, Texas Government Code, Section 657.004, sets for state agencies a goal of employing veterans in full-time positions equal to at least 20.0 percent of the total number of agency employees.

In fiscal year 2020, the agency's total percent of veterans employed was higher than the statewide average and had increased since fiscal year 2019.
