
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

Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Employees


The agency's full-time equivalent (FTE) employee limitation decreased by 9.4 percent to 57.5 FTEs in fiscal year 2022 compared with fiscal year 2021. Compared with fiscal year 2018, the agency had a decrease of 6.3 (10.1 percent) in the total number of FTEs.






Employee Turnover a

Excluding interagency transfers, the turnover rate within the agency (27.4 percent) was higher than the statewide turnover rate (22.7 percent) and higher than the turnover rate of Article IV agencies (16.7 percent) during fiscal year 2022. The fiscal year 2022 agency turnover rate including employees who transferred to another state agency or higher education institution was 27.4 percent.





Compensation Information ^a

The average agency salary of \$87,385 in fiscal year 2022 represented an increase of 15.3 percent compared with the average agency salary in fiscal year 2018. In fiscal year 2022, 23.1 percent of employees were paid below the midpoint of the salary range to which they were assigned. Total agency expenditures for salaries and benefits were higher compared with fiscal year 2018.





Fiscal Year 2022 Workforce Demographics d

On average, employees at the agency were 50.9 years old and had 12.1 years of agency length of service. Of the agency's employees, 82.6 percent were 40 years old or older, and 34.2 percent had fewer than 5 years of agency length of service. The Employees Retirement System estimates that between fiscal years 2022 and 2026, 40.0 percent of the agency's workforce will be eligible to retire (based on fiscal year 2022 data).
