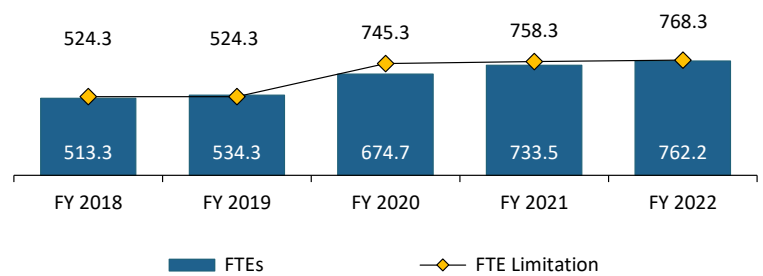
Based on information **self-reported** by the agency, the following items are noteworthy.

Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Employees

The agency's full-time equivalent (FTE) employee limitation increased by 1.3 percent to 768.3 FTEs in fiscal year 2022 compared with fiscal year 2021. Compared with fiscal year 2018, the agency had an increase of 248.9 (48.5 percent) in the total number of FTEs. In fiscal years 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, and 2022, the agency employed 71.2, 82.8, 90.5, 106.2, and 117.3 FTEs paid from non-appropriated funds. The agency also employed other exempted FTEs and student intern FTEs. These FTEs do not count toward the FTE limitation.

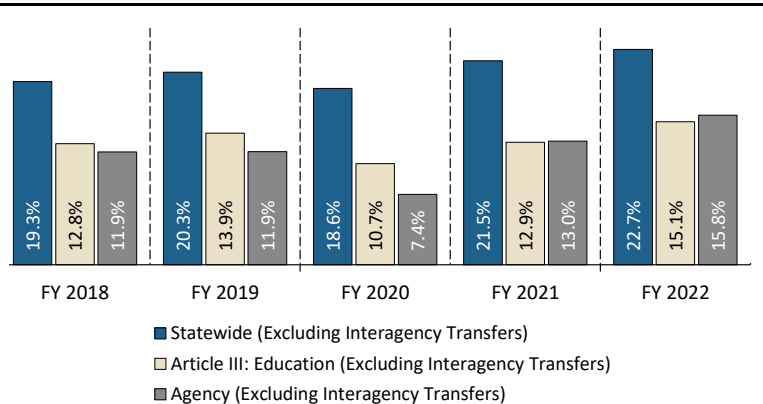
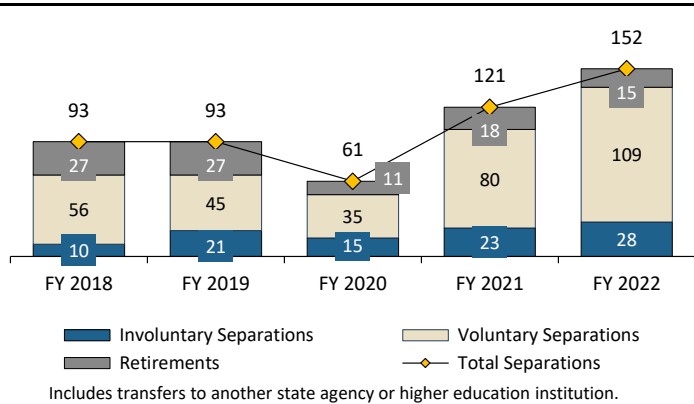

Employee Turnover^a

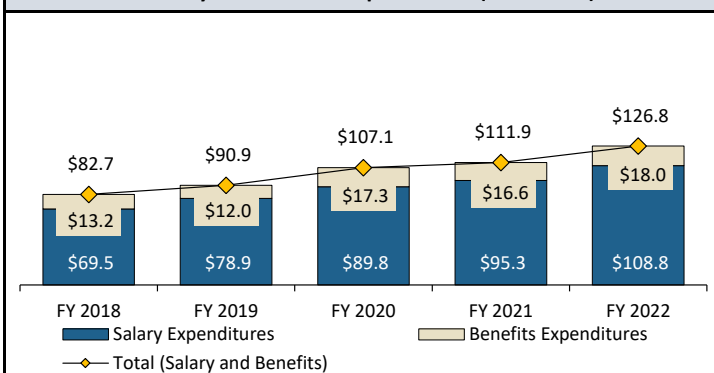
Excluding interagency transfers, the turnover rate within the agency (15.8 percent) was lower than the statewide turnover rate (22.7 percent) and higher than the turnover rate of Article III agencies (15.1 percent) during fiscal year 2022. The fiscal year 2022 agency turnover rate including employees who transferred to another state agency or higher education institution was 17.2 percent.



Compensation Information^a

The average agency salary of \$98,201 in fiscal year 2022 represented an increase of 13.4 percent compared with the average agency salary in fiscal year 2018. In fiscal year 2022, 22.5 percent of employees were paid below the midpoint of the salary range to which they were assigned. Total agency expenditures for salaries and benefits were higher compared with fiscal year 2018.

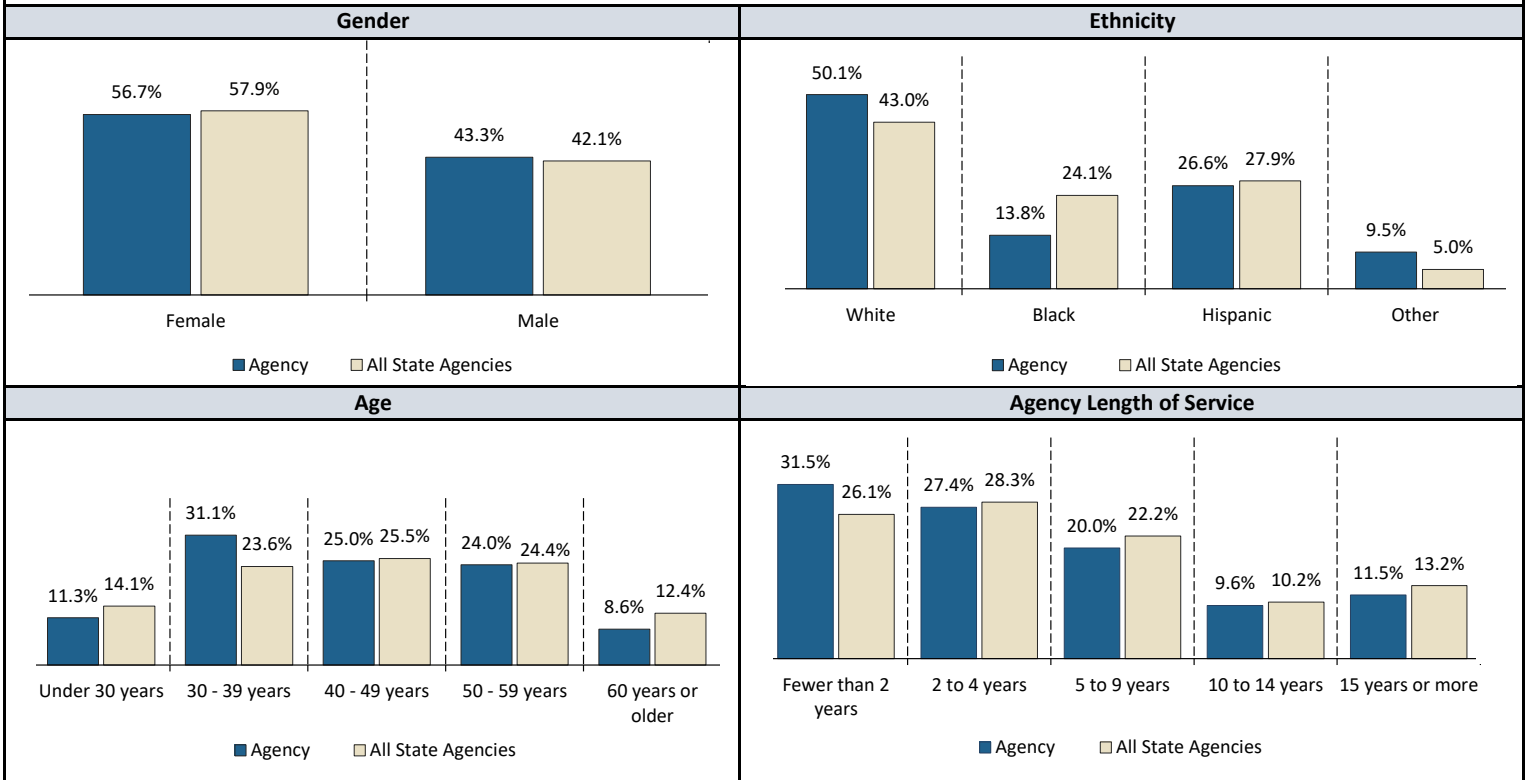

Fiscal Year 2022 Workforce Demographics ^c

On average, employees at the agency were 43.9 years old and had 6.2 years of agency length of service. Of the agency's employees, 57.6 percent were 40 years old or older, and 58.9 percent had fewer than 5 years of agency length of service.

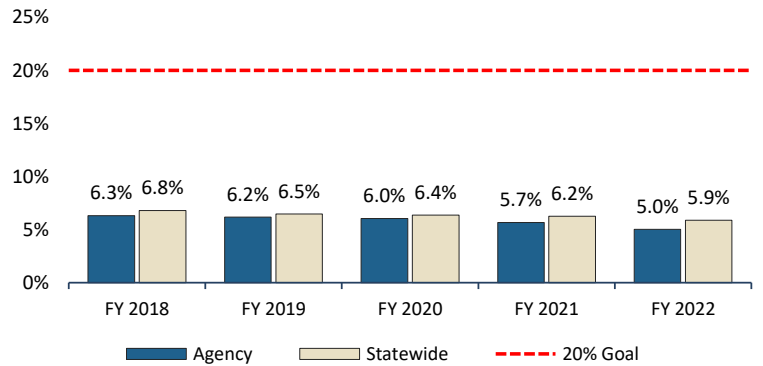

Veteran Employment ^d

Effective fiscal year 2016, Texas Government Code, Section 657.004, sets for state agencies a goal of employing veterans in full-time positions equal to at least 20.0 percent of the total number of agency employees.

In fiscal year 2022, the agency's total percent of veterans employed was lower than the statewide average and had decreased since fiscal year 2021.
