Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Employees


The agency's full-time equivalent (FTE) employee limitation decreased by 23.1 percent to 10.0 FTEs in fiscal year 2022 compared with fiscal year 2021. Compared with fiscal year 2018, the agency had a decrease of 0.6 (5.9 percent) in the total number of FTEs.



Employee Turnover ^a

Excluding interagency transfers, the turnover rate within the agency (11.8 percent) was lower than the statewide turnover rate (22.7 percent) and lower than the turnover rate of Article VIII and Self-Directed, Semi-Independent (SDSI) agencies (14.7 percent) during fiscal year 2022. The fiscal year 2022 agency turnover rate including employees who transferred to another state agency or higher education institution was 11.8 percent.





Compensation Information a

The average agency salary of \$79,128 in fiscal year 2022 represented an increase of 10.2 percent compared with the average agency salary in fiscal year 2018. In fiscal year 2022, 55.9 percent of employees were paid below the midpoint of the salary range to which they were assigned. Total agency expenditures for salaries and benefits were higher compared with fiscal year 2018.





On average, employees at the agency were 46.8 years old and had 7.8 years of agency length of service. Of the agency's employees, 73.5 percent were 40 years old or older, and 64.8 percent had fewer than 5 years of agency length of service.
