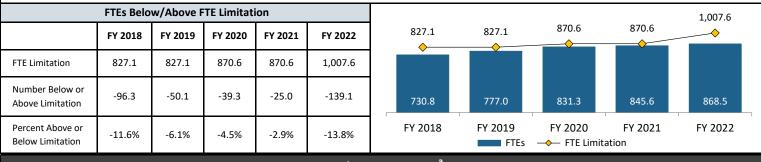

Based on information self-reported by the agency, the following items are noteworthy.

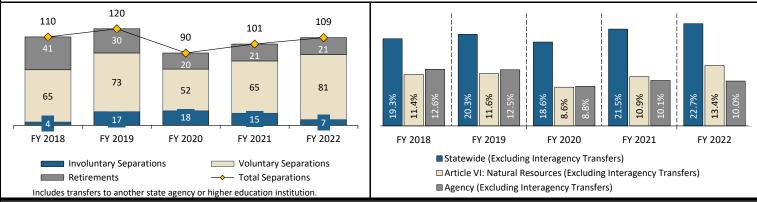
Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Employees

The agency's full-time equivalent (FTE) employee limitation increased by 15.7 percent to 1,007.6 FTEs in fiscal year 2022 compared with fiscal year 2021. Compared with fiscal year 2018, the agency had an increase of 137.7 (18.8 percent) in the total number of FTEs.



Employee Turnover^a

Excluding interagency transfers, the turnover rate within the agency (10.0 percent) was lower than the statewide turnover rate (22.7 percent) and lower than the turnover rate of Article VI agencies (13.4 percent) during fiscal year 2022. The fiscal year 2022 agency turnover rate including employees who transferred to another state agency or higher education institution was 12.2 percent.



Compensation Information a

The average agency salary of \$69,409 in fiscal year 2022 represented an increase of 16.6 percent compared with the average agency salary in fiscal year 2018. In fiscal year 2022, 20.0 percent of employees were paid below the midpoint of the salary range to which they were assigned. Total agency expenditures for salaries and benefits were higher compared with fiscal year 2018.

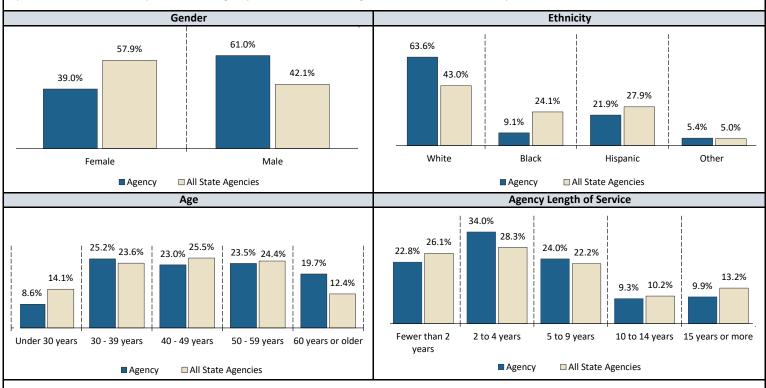

Fiscal Year 2022 Workforce Demographics ^c

On average, employees at the agency were 47.3 years old and had 6.5 years of agency length of service. Of the agency's employees, 66.2 percent were 40 years old or older, and 56.8 percent had fewer than 5 years of agency length of service. The Employees Retirement System estimates that between fiscal years 2022 and 2026, 18.0 percent of the agency's workforce will be eligible to retire (based on fiscal year 2022 data).
