

Excluding interagency transfers, the turnover rate within the agency (0.0 percent) was lower than the statewide turnover rate (16.5 percent) and lower than the turnover rate of Article IV agencies (12.7 percent) during fiscal year 2024. The fiscal year 2024 agency turnover rate including employees who transferred to another state agency or higher education institution was 0.0 percent.

Compensation Information ^a

The average agency salary of \$98,081 in fiscal year 2024 represented an increase of 11.4 percent compared with the average agency salary in fiscal year 2020. In fiscal year 2024, 66.7 percent of employees were paid below the midpoint of the salary range to which they were assigned. Total agency expenditures for salaries and benefits were higher compared with fiscal year 2020.




