

Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Employees


The agency's full-time equivalent (FTE) employee limitation increased by 27.5 percent to 417.0 FTEs in fiscal year 2024 compared with fiscal year 2023. Compared with fiscal year 2020, the agency had an increase of 72.0 (24.8 percent) in the total number of FTEs. In fiscal years 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023, the agency employed 1.0, 14.3, 41.8, and 46.0 federally funded FTEs. Those FTEs do not count toward the FTE limitation.



Employee Turnover ^a

Excluding interagency transfers, the turnover rate within the agency (9.4 percent) was lower than the statewide turnover rate (16.5 percent) and lower than the turnover rate of Article VII agencies (11.0 percent) during fiscal year 2024. The fiscal year 2024 agency turnover rate including employees who transferred to another state agency or higher education institution was 10.7 percent.





Compensation Information ^a

The average agency salary of \$82,008 in fiscal year 2024 represented an increase of 20.8 percent compared with the average agency salary in fiscal year 2020. In fiscal year 2024, 26.2 percent of employees were paid below the midpoint of the salary range to which they were assigned. Total agency expenditures for salaries and benefits were higher compared with fiscal year 2020.





Fiscal Year 2024 Workforce Demographics d

On average, employees at the agency were 48.8 years old and had 7.9 years of agency length of service. Of the agency's employees, 75.2 percent were 40 years old or older, and 51.5 percent had fewer than 5 years of agency length of service. The Employees Retirement System estimates that between fiscal years 2024 and 2028, 29.0 percent of the agency's workforce will be eligible to retire (based on fiscal year 2024 data).
