


Fiscal Year 2024 Workforce Demographics^e

On average, employees at the agency were 48.3 years old and had 8.1 years of agency length of service. Of the agency's employees, 73.1 percent were 40 years old or older, and 44.0 percent had fewer than 5 years of agency length of service. The Employees Retirement System estimates that between fiscal years 2024 and 2028, 27.0 percent of the agency's workforce will be eligible to retire (based on fiscal year 2024 data).



In fiscal year 2024, the agency's total percent of veterans employed was higher than the statewide average and had decreased since fiscal year 2023.
