Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Employees





Employee Turnover a

Excluding interagency transfers, the turnover rate within the agency (22.2 percent) was higher than the statewide turnover rate (16.5 percent) and higher than the turnover rate of Article VIII and SDSI agencies (10.0 percent) during fiscal year 2024. The fiscal year 2024 agency turnover rate including employees who transferred to another state agency or higher education institution was 22.2 percent.





Compensation Information ^a

The average agency salary of \$86,074 in fiscal year 2024 represented an increase of 9.2 percent compared with the average agency salary in fiscal year 2020. In fiscal year 2024, 45.6 percent of employees were paid below the midpoint of the salary range to which they were assigned. Total agency expenditures for salaries and benefits were higher compared with fiscal year 2020.




